## INDUS HEALTH NETWORK





### **HEALTHCARE CRISIS IN PAKISTAN**



Pakistan is the 5th most populous country in the world with more than 200 million people residing in it. Despite these numbers, only 0.9% of the total GDP is spent on improving the health sector.



Pakistan not only faces a limited provision of health facilities but various structural issues within it. For example, only 0.6 beds are available per 1,000 people with only 9.6 doctors for 10,000 people. Therefore, TIH has stepped up to improve the healthcare delivery scenario throughout Pakistan.

# **OUR STORIES**


Aisha, a pediatric Cancer Patient would have not been able to pursue her dream to become a software engineer. Her parents are thankful to the Indus hospital and staff who helped them in difficult times. He says, "My wife, Uzma, pregnant with our second child, caught Corona virus from me, and was denied admission in the hospital where she was registered. It was extremely depressing and we had almost lost hope to see our child alive! then God whispered through an angel. My colleague told me about the Indus Hospital Sheikh Saeed



Campus who not only agreed to take my wife's case but also took extreme precautions for a safe delivery of our child. With the help of the doctors and staff we were blessed with a baby girl. She was tested for COVID and declared negative. I'm extremely grateful to the hospital management and doctor for helping us in times of need"

Wasim, a security guard in Lyari, has a son and a daughter. His son Talal was born with congenital deformity. Wasim took him to various hospitals across Karachi but did not get any help. Later Wasim brought Talal to Indus Hospital where doctor Mehwish Zakir, an Orthotist/Prosthetist suggested that "Talal has short leg syndrome, a congenital disorder which often happens because of the position of developing foetus.' Talal was prescribed to wear an ankle-foot brace which helped him balance the length difference in his legs. After several months of training and rehabilitation Talal is now walking on his own with prosthetics (artificial limbs). Seeing Talal walking and moving independently makes his family and all of us believe in help and support in the shape of donors like you.
